Scaled differently (letter grade, percentages, credit/no credit)	Common scale			
What is included: Grade could also include othe factors such as attendance, participation, group work, overall performance in course, timely submission, or following instructions.	Includes only rubric categories (criteria) for a specific competency.			
Other factors may not include measures of learning outcomes.	Rubric categories measure Institutional Learning Outcomes.			
Other factors might not be direct measures of learning.	Rubric categories measure direct learning.			
High stakes for students	Low stakes for students

Oral communication is a prepared, purposeful presentation designed for a specific audience to increase knowledge, foster **ustde**ding, or promote change in the listeners' attitudes, values, beliefs, or behaviors. Consideration should be made for communication dividuals with diverse backgrounds ( , English as a non-primary language, communication disabilities, .).
