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A pattern of courses that community college students may use to complete the lower-division general educat

Some major requirements may also satisfy general education requirements (ie. double-count). Whenever possible, choose CSU GE classes of interest.

To find lower-division courses major course requirements at CSU, go to the <u>ASSIST</u> website (www.assist.org), and if applicable, complete an <u>Associate Degree for Transfer</u> (ADT) at Chabot College (see the Chabot College Catalog and/or <u>DegreeWorks</u> for ADT degrees).

Area F is not required prior to transfer, only for CSU graduation. However, courses in Area F can also be used in Area D (double counted).

#Each year the CSU GE pattern is updated, so select courses from the current year's CSU GE agreement.

Make an appointment with a Chabot College counselor to develop a <u>Student Educational Plan</u> (SEP) to clarify your goals and to map your course requirements.

Join a Chabot College <u>First Year Experience</u> (FYE), <u>Special Program</u>, and/or take a <u>Psychology-Counseling</u> (PSCN) course to enhance college success.

Meet with transfer reps & attend workshops in the <u>Transfer Center</u>. Attend Chabot College Transfer Day. Visit/tour transfer schools.

A process that verifies completion of lower division general education. Students must request CSU GE &^/ci-i&æci[] from the Chabot College Admissions Office at the same time that a final transcript is sent to []^ CSU campus they will attend. If CSU GE isn't completed prior to transfer, partial certification of CSU GE is also available. Certification is automatic for students earning AA-T or AS-T degrees.
