## A Quick Guide to Thesis Formatting. Things to Know Before Writing Your Thesis.

The *University Thesis Writing Guide* (*Guide*) <a href="http://www.csueastbay.edu/thesis">http://www.csueastbay.edu/thesis</a> is the source of information for writing a **Thesis**. Refer to the *Guide* for all **format requirements**, (such as margins, font block quotes, etc.). Use a **Stylebook** to **format** the **References** or **Works Cited** and **In-text Citations**.

Choose a **Style Guide** before writing, such as **APA**, **MLA**, **CMS** (**Turabian**) or the style recommended by your **Department**. The Thesis must have 4 sections, which are marked in Bold below. The other sections are optional. The page order is: Title Page; Copyright Page; Abstract; Signature Page; Acknowledgments; Table of Contents; Lists of Figures, Graphs, Photos, Plates, Maps and Tables if used; Preface; Page 1-End of thesis content; Endnotes, if not in text or end of chapters; Reference List or Work Cited; and Appendices.

To format the Title Page and Signature Page, refer to the Templates at the back of the *Guide*, p. 19.

Use the same margins for the entire Thesis including the Appendices, Graphs, and Charts. Make the Left Margin 1.5 Inches, the Right Margin 1 inch, and the Top and Bottom Margins must each be 1.25 inches. Use this page as a template.

Indent all paragraphs 0.5 inches; exception: do not indent the first paragraph of the Abstract. Indent Block Quotes 0.5 inches from both the left and right margins. Appendices.
