Fostering Student Resilience:

A CALL TO ACTION FOR FACULTY, BY FACULTY

Cal State East Bay attracts extraordinarily diverse and motivated students.

DID YOU KNOW ...?

- Over 60% of our students are the rst in their families to attend college.
- Many of our students come from low-income backgrounds, with 41% of our undergraduates qualifying for federal Pell Grants.
- Despite this commitment and hard work, fewer than half of entering rst-year CSUEB students graduate in 6 years.

WHY IS THIS HAPPENING?

- Students balance multiple obligations.
 The Learning Framework needs assessment in 2017-2018 indicated that many students spend more hours engaged in paid work and care-giving than on academics.
- Students have challenges meeting their basic needs.
 A 2016 survey of 770 CSUEB students found that nearly 50% experience food insecurity and 20% had experienced homelessness in the past 12 months.
- Students have di culty accessing help. Students don't always know where to seek help. And when they do, some report feeling uncomfortable, unwelcome, or that their needs weren't understood.
- Students experience opportunity gaps. These challenges and others may compound with systemic barriers, discrimination, and micro-aggressions that disproportionately a ect Black and Latinx students, LGBTQ+ students, and students with disabilities.

WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO ADDRESS THIS?

- It is vital to uphold the promise of public higher
 education. The California State University system is the
 nation's largest 4-year public university system. It serves
 an indispensable role in providing accessible educationxto
 students from all backgrounds.
- We must support our students' ability to reach their x aspirational goals.
