Ned Chapin, Professor Emeritus of the Department of Accounting Passed Away December 27, 2014



Ned Chapin, Professor Emeritus of the Department of Accounting at the University of California, Berkeley, passed away December 27, 2014. He began his career at UC Berkeley in 1961, became a full professor in 1967, and retired in September 1992.

Computer Science Pioneer, ~~Professor Ned L. Chapin Passed~~
was born in the Cleveland area in 1921. After attending the University of Washington, Oregon, and California before settling for San Francisco State High School in 1945, he attended Stanford University where he played football and was in the Stanford Orchestral. He received his M.A. from the University of Michigan in 1948 and his doctorate from the Illinois Institute of Technology in 1950. He moved to Berkeley, California where he lived for the rest of his life. After working at the Lawrence Radiation Research Institute now SLAC for 11 years, he taught at the University of California at Berkeley. He was an independent consultant, a Visiting Professor at the University of California at Berkeley, and a Professor Emeritus, Consultant, Systems in the California State University system.

Dr. Ned Chapin was a leader in the field of computer science, particularly the discipline of Software Maintenance, from its infancy in the 1960s. He published more than 250 papers and conference proceedings and wrote 12 books, including "An Introduction to Electronic Computers" in 1952, the second general purpose commercially published book on computers, "Introduction to Computer Approach" in 1971. He was the founding editor of the "Journal of Computer Maintenance and Evolution". He often referred to his love of long walks and meditation. For example, he was a participant at the first meeting of the Society of Software Maintenance and Evolution in 1977/1978.

He was predeceased by his wife Mary over many years. Dr. Chapin is survived by his two daughters, Sue and Linda, and his son, Fred. Chapin died on December 27, 2014. Riddle. His hobbies included reading, science fiction, walking, photography, bird watching, hunting for mushrooms, and advocating for the environment.
