Alliteration: The repetition of introductory consonant sounds that occur close together in sequence.

Allusion: A reference to another person, place, or thing.

Ex: Five score years ago, a great American, in whose symbolic shadow we stand today, signed the Emancipation Proclamation. [MLK]

Anaphora: The repetition of a word or phrase at the beginning of successive clauses.
